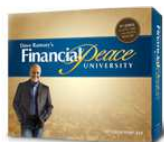


Financial Peace University

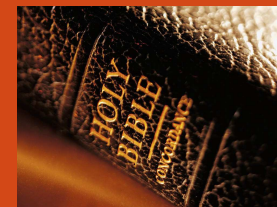
